

meet ups. We will be continuing our discussion of Part 2 The Communal Realm.


BIBLE & BREWS

Reducing waste around the holidays can make a big impact. Here are some simple ways to cut down on waste while still enjoying the festivities:

- Use reusable shopping bags
- Get creative with reusable or recycled decorations
- Borrow or reuse holiday costumes
- Use recycled gift wrapping like newspaper or old maps

- Buy local to reduce shipping-related emissions
- Give gifts that don't need packaging like memberships, tickets, subscriptions, or gift certificates
- Switch to LED holiday lights or even better, solar powered lights
- Separate your recycling and remember these items cannot be recycled: string lights, ornaments, ribbons, bows, tinsel, foil, tissue paper, bubble wrap, styrofoam

By incorporating small, sustainable choices into your celebrations, you can reduce your environmental impact while still enjoying the holiday spirit.
