Dear Siblings in Christ,

Throughout this Lenten season we have been studying the Psalms, and we heard a good word from our Designated Conference Minister, the Rev. Phil Hodson recently. Now as we approach April we might be wondering, why is it not Easter yet? The trees are blooming, the daffodils are bobbing their heads in the wind, and yet Easter is not here yet. It actually lines up with the Orthodox calendar for once.

Yes, we would often like to just turn the page, jump ahead to the good parts. For us the good parts might mean chocolate egg cremes, Easter flowers and Resurrection. But from my vantage point at the end of March, we are still in Lent, we still have some weary roads to traverse before we arrive at Easter Morning on April 20th.

Rev. Phil Hodson encouraged us in our visioning event and again in worship on March 23rd, to lean into what he sees as the four table legs of the church: Evangelism, Discipleship, Mission, and Care. He noted that we care really well for each other at this church (Amen!) and that we are doing some things that speak to mission and discipleship. The biggest growing edge for all UCC churches though is evangelism. Sharing the good news, inviting friends to be in our worship space or part of our service projects; making sure that our wider community knows who we are and why we are here—it can be hard for us.

I don't have any pat answers how to fix this "evangelism problem" in our denomination, but I can encourage you all to invite a friend to worship, or to our community meal on April 22, or one of our remaining Lenten Lunches (Weds. April 2 & 9, respectively at Noon). If you are in conversation with someone and they are concerned about the times we are living in and if they say they feel

disconnected from community right now, that is your chance to say, "well, why not join me at church?" And then share the reasons why you choose to be here.

My hope is that NPUCC will continue to be a welcoming place for people where the message of hope is found. I hope that we continue to serve our local community (CROP Hunger Walk is coming May 4!), stand up for creation justice, and those sojourners in our midst.

For Holy Week we will have three events unique to this time of year—the first is the Maundy Thursday service with communion on Thursday, April 17th. The second is a Good Friday Bible Study, which will focus on how the 4 different gospels frame the death of Jesus. The third is adorning the cross on Holy Saturday, with fresh flowers from your gardens. Information about all of these gatherings can be found within this newsletter.

I look forward to traveling with you all the way to Easter morning as your pastor.

Sunday, May 4 at 1:00 pm starting in the courtyard of Des Moines U Methodist

This will be NPUCC's 36th CROP Walk—36 years of walking and partnering with CWS and folk all around the world. We partner with communities here and abroad to find sustainable and just ways



to curb hunger, poverty, and displacement. CWS is often the first responder to disasters—whether it be floods, fires, earthquakes. CWS focuses on community needs—clean water, just and sustainable farming practices, schools, and day centers for kids. NPUCC raises funds and hope as we walk alongside our neighbors from Southminster Presbyterian and Des Moines U Methodist. 25% of what we raise goes to our Des Moines Area Food bank. 75% goes to CWS.




"STOP THE BLEED" EMERGENCY RESPONSE TRAINING
